Leaning Briefing: Application of the Levels of Need by Partners

This learning briefing has been produced following a multi-agency audit of referrals to the Worcestershire Family Front Door. The aim of the briefing is to help all professionals across the partnership to improve the way they use the Worcestershire Levels of Need Guidance document to decide whether a referral to the Family Front Door is the correct step at that point, or whether the child or young person could be better helped via another route.

The ASK Online Workshop - Assessing Suicide in Kids

The ASK Workshop is an accredited suicide prevention workshop that specifically addresses suicide risk in children.

It is designed for professionals working with children of ages 5-14 years and seeks to challenges commonly held notions about children's capacity to consider suicide and provide them with practical tools that support their understanding of what can best help a child contemplating suicide.

Please note that whilst the training makes regular reference to safety planning, it does not teach safety planning, instead recommending that you attend ASIST – Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training.
